A MESSAGE FROM OUR TREASURER

As the Association Treasurer it is a pleasure for me to report to you members that in all the years that I have been your Treasurer this is the first year I can happily report that your Association is in fairly good financial condition. We had a very good year on our income side, and we have had very good luck in controlling our expenses. At the family reunion this September in Branson, MO I will be reporting that our actual income exceeded our budgeted amount by approximately \$17,562. This is due in a great part by the generous support of you members. I would ask that you please continue your contributions for this year, and all the years coming, so that your Association can continue to grow. I would like to remind the life members of their Publication Assessment, and all of the members of the Fidelity

Fund. On the expense side of our budget, your Association President, along with Association Business Manager and Financial Director have done an outstanding job of reducing our expenses. We still exceeded our budgeted expenses by approximately \$2,300, but this is a lot less than the \$10,000 to \$15,000 losses that we had in years past.

In closing I would again like to thank all of you great Marines for your support and please keep up the good work.



Many of you who have attended the past few reunions are aware we have conducted both a silent and live auction to raise operating funds for Association expenses. I'm encouraging members to donate items...







NPRC Offers DD-214 Web Site

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has a website for Veterans to get their DD-214s online by going to http://vetrecs.archives.gov.

NPRC is working to make it easier for Veterans with computers and Internet access to get copies of documents from their military files. Military Veterans, and the next-of-kin of deceased former military members, may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents.

Other individuals who need documents must complete the Standard Form (SF)-180, which can be downloaded from the online website. Requesters are asked information essential for NPRC to process the request, so delays to fulfill the request will be minimized by using the website.

THE MARINE MILITARY ACADEMY



Do you know where this Iwo Jima Memorial Monument is? If you said Arlington, VA, you would be wrong. This one is in Harlingen, Texas, on the campus of the Marine Military Academy. Look closely at the palm trees in the background.

Sculptor Dr. Felix W. de Weldon, then on duty with the U.S. Navy, was so moved after the original Iwo Jima photo was released that he constructed a scale model within 48 hours. He labored for 9.5 years to prepare a working, full-sized

Weldon's summer home and studio in Newport, R.I., for storage.

On Nov. 10, 1954, the 179th anniversary of the U.S. Marine Corps, President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially dedicated the bronze memorial in Washington. In

October 1981, Dr. de Weldon gifted his original, full sized working model to the Marine Military Academy, as an inspiration to the young cadets. The Marine placing the flagpole into the ground on Mount Suribachi was a South Texas native, Cpl Harlon H. Block



of Weslaco, Texas. Block's ropedoff gravesite resides just a few yards directly behind the Iwo Jima monument.

We, the Third Marine Division Association, annually give a plaque and a \$100 scholarship to the Cadet of the Year at the Marine Military Academy in Harlingen, TX. This year's honor went to Cadet Corporal Victor Olawale-Apanpa:

model from molding plaster of the survivors of the flag raising. Once the statue was completed in plaster, it was carefully disassembled and trucked to Brooklyn, N.Y., for casting in bronze. After the three-year casting process, the bronze parts were trucked to Washington, D.C., for erection at Arlington National Cemetery. The plaster

working model was moved to Dr. de



Victor demonstrated outstanding qualities in Military and academic achievement to have earned this award. His extraordinary efforts have earned him acceptance into the **United States Military Academy at West Point**. The Third Marine Division Association is very proud to have honored Victor.

The Marine Military Academy in Harlingen, Texas is the only military college-preparatory boarding school in the world based on the traditions, values and ideals of the United States Marine Corps. "One hundred percent (100%) of MMA graduates are accepted into colleges or universities. MMA is a



military school whose mission is to prepare young men for college and responsible leadership. Marine Military Academy provides opportunities to our cadets that will help them realize their full potential. Our mission is educating and training young men based on Marine Corps tradition."

The Texas Chapter holds 2 Reunions every year, Spring and Fall, and the last time we held a Reunion in Harlingen, Texas was October, 2013. The Marine Military Academy is an amazing place. We got to tour the barracks where we found the cadets know how to keep the barracks totally squared away.

They had a noon parade for us, followed by lunch in the mess hall. We also got up close and personal to the Iwo Jima Monument and visited the Iwo Jima Museum. The stories, the history, The Marine Corps pedigree courses throughout the veins of the Academy. If any of you get near Harlingen, Texas, I would encourage you to make the extra effort to visit the Academy/Iwo Jima Monument/Museum. It is worth it.

IWO JIMA SURVIVORS - SAVE THE DATE





CHAPTER Happenings



NEW ENGLAND CHAPTER

How we survive

Our Chapter has on our roll 47 members of whom 18 regularly attend the meetings with 4 additional attendees who are spouses, significant others, or "Friends of the Chapter". These are regular attendees who either they or their spouse were in the Marine Corps but other divisions or units, not the Third Marine Division.

We have through the years followed our original charter to have meetings in all six New England States over a five year period. As our chapter has "matured" we have recently voted on a change to this and now the location for each next meeting is voted on by the members based on ability to attend rather than the state. We hold 2 meetings per year. One in the Spring and one in the Fall. For many years we hosted a picnic at our home in CT in the summer but travel became more difficult for many members. We usually attend meetings in Mystic, CT, Kittery, Maine or South Yarmouth, MA on Cape Cod. These locations have accommodations that are reasonable, managers we have worked with for years that provide meeting rooms for us at no cost and a range of excellent restaurants and entertainment venues. (Shopping, theaters, plays, museums, historical sites, etc.)

Our group has been together for many years and all are dedicated to our chapter, open to warmly welcoming new members and active participants in all meeting discussions. All voices are respectfully heard, excellent minutes are kept for each meeting and shared in our newsletter which is sent electronically or by mail. When members cannot attend a note is sent to them about how they were missed. Communication, care, concern and mutual respect is at the core of our chapter. The Chaplain's role is to send out these notes, all Get Well, Sympathy and encouragement notes. We do not currently send Birthday cards except for special birthday's (90th)

We hold a raffle of member donated items at the end of each meeting to raise some funds for the Chapter. This is an active and lively culmination to each meeting. At the end of the meeting the group goes to lunch together. Once a year the chapter contributes \$100.00 toward a

lunch (this does not include alcoholic drinks). We have also found that individual checks at the restaurant reduce any potential ill will. For most of our meetings the majority of members get to the location on the night before the meeting and socialize and go to dinner. The next day is our meeting and raffle (this is about two hours) and then we go to lunch. The rest of the day until dinner time is free time for a variety of activities (naps to shopping, etc.) Sometimes we just go out to a restaurant for appetizers and drinks or have a pizza delivered to the hotel. This is a time of socializing and catching up on members activities since we last met. We all meet for breakfast in the hotel the next morning, give our good byes (we are a group into hugs and kisses) and express our best wishes to each other.

TEXAS CHAPTER

The Texas Chapter Spring Reunion was held in Huntsville, TX., April 4 - 7, 2019. Sadly we had to change the date rather late because of a hotel indiscretion, so our attendance was unusually low, as many already had other commitments. However, those of us who were able to attend had a great time.



Huntsville was General Sam Houston's last home. He was an American soldier and politician. An important leader of the Texas Revolution, Houston served as the 1st and 3rd president of the Republic of Texas, and was one of the first two individuals to represent Texas in the United States Senate. He also served as the 6th Governor of Tennessee and the seventh governor of Texas, the only American to be elected governor of two different states in the United States. We toured his home, museum, and historic campus.

We also saw the world's tallest statue of an American hero, at 67 feet tall (on a 10-foot-tall base), Sam Houston, towers over Interstate 45 just south of Huntsville.

We visited the H.E.A.R.T.S. Veterans Museum, which was crammed full of military gear. Five cadets from Sam Houston State University ROTC joined us there, and as we concluded our tour of the museum, we all sat down and shared stories. The cadets told us why they wanted to serve their country and enter the military as officers. It was a very nice exchange. We took them to lunch after that.



We went to a horse ranch (this is Texas) to see the very unique and beautiful Gypsy Cob horses. This ranch has had many champions and they were very generous to let us see and pet their well behaved horses. The owner also prepared an excellent lunch for us. She/they could not have been any nicer.

Our final event was the most amazing performance by the Sam Houston State University Symphony, joined by the school of dance to combine for some extraordinary performances. At intermission, the Head of the Music Department recognized our group and we got a roaring standing ovation. He recognized that 3 in our group had graduated from Sam Houston. Later, the symphony honored us with the playing of the Marines Hymn. As we rose as one to sing, the audience respectfully remained seated but roared their approval. The Department head also invited us to a pre performance reception, just for us. We were treated royally.



Our next Reunion is October 10 - 13, 2019 in McKinney, TX (Dallas area). We will honor and celebrate our WWII guys.

NEW COMMANDANT

LtGen David H. Berger

Commanding General, Marine Corps Combat Development Command / Deputy Commandant for Combat Development and Integration

Lieutenant General Berger was commissioned as an infantry officer in 1981 following graduation from Tulane University. As a Lieutenant and Captain, he served as platoon commander in 1st Marine Division, and later as Company Commander and battalion Operations Officer in 2d Reconnaissance Battalion during Operation DESERT STORM. He also served as Officer Selection Officer in Roanoke, Virginia.



As a field grade officer, Lieutenant General Berger was an instructor at Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron One (MAWTS-1) in Yuma, Arizona; instructor at III Marine Expeditionary Force Special Operations Training Group; and served on the Joint Staff as a policy planner in the Strategic Plans and Policy Directorate, J-5.

Lieutenant General Berger commanded 3d Battalion, 8th Marines from 2002 to 2004, deploying the battalion first to Okinawa, and later to Haiti in support of Operation SECURE TOMORROW. As a Colonel, Lieutenant General Berger commanded Regimental Combat Team 8 in Fallujah, Iraq during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. While serving as Assistant Division Commander of 2d Marine Division, he was appointed to the rank of Brigadier General. He then deployed to Kosovo, where he served for one year as Chief of Staff for KFOR Headquarters in Pristina. From 2009 to 2011, he served at Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps as the Director of Operations in the Department of Plans, Policies, and Operations.

In 2012, he deployed to Afghanistan as the Commanding General of 1st Marine Division (Forward) in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM.

In July 2014, Lieutenant General Berger was promoted to his current rank and assumed command of I Marine Expeditionary Force and subsequently assumed command of U.S. Marine Corps Forces, Pacific.

On 28 August 2018, Lieutenant General Berger assumed responsibility as the Commanding General, Marine Corps Combat Development Command, and the Deputy Commandant for Combat Development and Integration, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps.

In addition to a B.S. in Engineering, he holds a Master of International Public Policy from Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies, and a M.S. in Military Studies. His formal military education includes the U.S. Army Infantry Officer Advanced Course, U.S. Marine Corps Command and Staff College, and U.S. Marine Corps School of Advanced Warfighting. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Ranger School, Jumpmaster School, U.S. Navy Dive School, and U.S. Marine Corps Amphibious Reconnaissance School.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

I was disappointed when told of the Committee's hearing titled, "Learning from Whistleblowers at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)," scheduled for June 25, 2019.

When the hearing was formally scheduled, the Department was notified that you intended to listen to the experiences of VA whistleblowers and focus on how they understood the process for allegations of departmental mismanagement and misconduct. You are also apparently seeking information on encounters whistleblowers have had with VA offices tasked with overseeing whistleblower protection and employee accountability. What is entirely missing from the hearing is any official from the Department who could offer your Committee historical context and facts that would shed light on a complex issue; as of this writing, no Department official is slated to testify.

Furthermore, your Committee would not disclose who would be testifying from the whistleblowers' perspective, and I did not learn of the three witnesses who are Department employees until I read a news article in USA Today this past weekend. Two of the witnesses named in the article submitted their whistleblower complaints several years before the Office of Accountability and Whistleblower Protection was established in 2017. As you know, the Department is limited in what we can discuss publicly regarding their individual concerns due to Privacy Act conditions.

When the Committee holds a hearing to air criticisms of the Department, while simultaneously preventing the Department from participating to offer context and defend itself, the Committee's efforts risk appearing more like a political press conference than a hearing aimed at a balanced look at serious issues. If this is how the Committee intends to conduct oversight of the Department in the future, an exclusionary approach could chip away at the Committee's oft stated goal of bipartisanship.

John celebrated his 100th Birthday on July 9, 2019, in Vista, California. John is a Life member of the Third Marine Division Association. He wore his uniform last March at an Iwo Jima Commemorative Banquet where he was honored as the oldest veteran. He also wore his uniform for his birthday party. John also wrote a book about his adventures in the Marine Corp entitled, "Through it all....Stories From 'the Top".

His party was attended by about 80 people, including a contingency of about 15 Marines from Camp Pendleton. He was one of the first Marines to march the 55 miles from Camp Elliott to the newly established Camp Pendleton in September 1942 and was one of the first Marines in the newly formed 3rd Marine Division. He saw combat with the Fighting 3rd on Bougainville, Guam and Iwo Jima, saw the raised flag and every morning would look at Mt. Suribachi first to see if it was still flying. That brought him great hope and inspiration he said. In the Korean War, John served with the 1st Marine Division at Pusan Perimeter, the Inchon Landing and at Frozen Chosen.

Ten students to be honored with Memorial Scholarship grants for 2019 - 2020

Once again, our Third Marine Division Association will honor outstanding students of Association family members with important college and university scholarship grants for the coming 2019 – 2020 academic year. The grants are funded mostly by the unselfish donations to our scholarship fund each year by members of the Association.

Memorial Scholarship Fund Trustees - headed by Steven Johnson - administer this far reaching scholarship program which was established in 1969 to honor the loss in Vietnam on 14 Nov. 1967 of 3MD Commanding Officer Major General Bruno A. Hockmuth at age fifty-seven. The first award was presented in 1973. As of the 2019 – 2020 school year, 812 scholarship awards of more than \$675,000 have been presented to deserving students based solely on financial need.

These awards include the LtCol Jones award, given each year to the student with the greatest financial need. There have been 11 awards totaling \$15,600 since commencing in the 2008 –2009 school year. The family of LtCol Richard "Dick" E. Jones USMC generously funds this award. He was one of the earliest and longest serving members of the

Memorial Scholarship Fund's Board of Trustees, first appointed in 1978 and was a member until 2005 when serious medical problems forced his resignation from the Board.
