



OKINAWA, Japan – Major General William M. Jurney transitioned command of 3d Marine Division to Major General James W. Bierman Aug. 13, 2020 at Camp Courtney, Okinawa, Japan.

Jurney has served as the commanding general of 3d Marine Division since July 2018 and will be assuming the duties as the Commanding General of Marine Air Ground Task Force Training Command and Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center in September 2020 at Twentynine Palms, California.

Reflecting on his past two years, Jurney shared a message: "I just want to say thank you to all across the Caltrap Division. It has been an absolute honor to serve alongside such dedicated professionals. You have remained forward deployed and forward employed strengthening our relationships in the region, advancing our future operational capabilities and ready to step-up in time of crisis. I'm proud of each and every one of you. Keep leading and keep making a difference, as I know you will."

Under Jurney's leadership, the Division emphasized discipline, trust and proficiency while continuously improving operational readiness and capabilities. During his two years as the commanding general, 3d Marine Division actively contributed to regional security across the Indo-Pacific, strengthening partner networks and increasing interoperability through numerous bilateral exercises and collaborative training events. Additionally, Jurney led efforts to implement future force concepts to include a focus on distributed operations and the integration of long-range precision fires.

NPRC Offers DD-214 Web Site

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has a website for Veterans to get their DD-214s online by going to http://vetrecs.archives.gov.

NPRC is working to make it easier for Veterans with computers and Internet access to get copies of documents from their military files. Military Veterans, and the next-of-kin of deceased former military members, may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents.

Other individuals who need documents must complete the Standard Form (SF)-180, which can be downloaded from the online website. Requesters are asked information essential for NPRC to process the request, so delays to fulfill the request will be minimized by using the website.

I'm a VETERAN! I would do it all over again and again.



None of us are likely to forget what this crisis has wrought for us. Perhaps you've lost a loved one or battled the virus yourself. It could be that you've been strained by the isolation, you were unable to get the care you needed, or your edges have simply frayed from the incredible amount of stress we've all been under. Every storm leaves wreckage in its wake, and this one is no different.

No matter the case, your mental health is critical. Be kind to yourself, and if you feel you are in need of help please take the time to get it. Call the Veterans Crisis Line at 1-800-273-8255 and press 1. Make an appointment at your local VA Vet Center or talk to your physician. Reach out to a friend. Ask for help.

I'm exceptionally proud of the work of our members, volunteers and staff during this time. My sincere thanks go out to you—most especially to the entire medical community, the first responders and the incredible staff at VA medical centers across the nation for their absolutely tireless dedication to treating patients and rising to this occasion, far beyond what any of us could have envisioned.

Your exceptional and creative efforts to continue caring for one another were beacons of hope in foreboding seas. We know that we are not out of the woods yet, but you have led the way through these dark times as examples of strength, compassion and fortitude for us all to emulate as we move forward together and begin to restore the nation.

MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND APPLICATIONS FOR 2021-2022

The MSF Board of Trustees has announced the application, eligibility requirements, and IVISF Plan for the next academic 2021-2022 will be available 1 December 2020 on the Association website www.caltrap.org. This is a post-high school scholarship program for the children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of Assn members. Also eligible are recently discharged Marines, who served honorably with the Third Marine Division and military personnel attached to it e.g. men and women of the US Navy Hospital Corps, Chaplain Corps, etc. Award amounts generally range from \$500 to \$1,200 per academic year based on financial need but Fund Trustees may award more based on special circumstances.

The MSF was established in 1969 to honor the loss in the Republic of Vietnam on 14 Nov 1967 of Third Marine Division Commanding Officer Major General Bruno A. Hockmuth.

To date, 822 scholarship awards of \$685,600 have been presented to deserving students based solely on financial need. Each year the prestigious LtCol Richard E Jones USMC (Ret) scholarship in the amount of \$1,200 is also awarded. The family of LtCol Jones, in memory of his service to his Country, Marine Corps, and the Association generously funds this award annually for students with the greatest financial need.
