Those of you who were at the banquet in Fort Worth last September may remember my Soap Box. I made it loud as I moved it to the front of the stage so you could see it and it would get your attention. For those who were not there, this was the purpose. Let me now stand on my soap box again:



(Susan Huck approved this. I read it to her. We had several tearful moments in our long conversation. As sad as she is about Jerry's death, she is glad that I am using it for good and perhaps saving lives. I told her his death probably saved my life. We both sobbed through that.)

WE NEED TO TAKE CARE OF OURSELVES. Many it that banquet room had been exposed to **Agent Orange** in Vietnam. Many of us have paid quite a price for Agent Orange exposure.

- One of the most beloved people in the Third Marine Division Association was Jerry Huck. Jerry and his wife Susan were on the Reunion Committee for years. In fact, Jerry and Susan were in that very room and the Hotel with the rest of the committee the previous September planning the reunion. Most of you know that Jerry died last February. Linda and I called Susan very quickly after his death to express our love and sadness. I talked to Susan several times after that to check on her. In one of my conversations with her when she was able to talk about it, we discussed the cause of his death. Either she or Jerry called me several times after he had gone to the emergency room several times with multiple issues, but no clear-cut reason. Well, later on, after his death, the cause came forward. A mole on his back was malignant and got into his system. Jerry was known for not liking doctors or going to them. The malignancy got advanced into his system and caused many problems, and ultimately his death. That got me to the Dermatologist. My wife Linda had been wanting us to go but I kept the excuses going. No more. After learning what caused Jerry's death, we went as soon as we could. Guess what, I had melanoma also, or skin cancer, like Jerry. I stood on the stage that evening in Fort Worth with part of an ear missing and two holes in my neck and shoulder. But I was still standing. I wish Jerry had gone to the doctor in time and been there too. So please, everyone, get checked out. Life is precious. Be a survivor!
- The second thing on my mind that evening on my soap box was men, please check for prostate cancer. There is a simple blood test, and sometimes an uncomfortable "finger wave". There were some of us in that room that night who have been treated for prostate cancer. Catch it early enough and you can usually survive it. We have many friends at home also who have been treated for it. Agent Orange is notorious for prostate cancer.

My purpose that evening, and now, is to encourage everyone to please get checked out. Our health is more important than gold. Interestingly enough, someone who was at the banquet that night called me just a few weeks after the reunion to tell me that she went to the Dermatologist and sure enough, found melanoma. She was grateful for my soap box.

You, Third Marine Division Association family, happen to be very important. Please, let's band together and promise we will take care of ourselves. Life is precious and friends and family are of utmost importance.

Be a survivor!


FROM THE ASSOCIATION MANAGER

Association Funds Fact per Chesty

How many Association members know what funds the Assn administers and what they are for? Our roving reporter recently interviewed the oldest K-9 Marine MGySgt Chesty USMC (Ret) at the kennel in San Diego CA. See his photo in this article. Chesty said: "Grrrrr - what -you tell me this is not common knowledge in the 3MDA! I feel like biting someone on his or her rump. So here is the scoop, right from the Top's jaws. Also, I better see 1,500 + swinging you know what at the Reunion In San Diego, buy a lot of raffle tickets too, Grrrrrr and out!"

So based on Chesty's orders here is the information for each of the Assn Funds

- 1. Caltrap Fund. To pay for the printing and postage of the quarterly Caltrap magazine. The quarterly Caltrap costs about \$4,900 for printing and postage.
- 2. Caltrap Advertising. To pay for Caltrap ads and especially those members who want to place an "In Memoriam" ad for a fallen comrade.
- 3. Operating Fund. To provide necessary financial support for Association operations and some of our humanitarian and charitable programs as well as
- 4. Dedicated Member page. This is to help pay for the printing of the Annual Reunion Journal given out at each reunion.
- 5. The Fidelity Fund. This is a Fund where members want to honor the 3MD motto of "Fidelity Honor Valor"



- 6. The Life Member Fund. The Assn has 1,500+ active members of which 1,342 do not pay dues, as they are Life & Honorary Members. This Fund allows these members to continue to support the organization even though with a Life membership their one time payment many years ago relieved them of making an annual dues payment. For the Assn fiscal year 2021 these 1,342 members made donations of \$4,085 an average of \$3.04. The other 208 annual dues members made donations of \$5,995 an average of \$28.82.
- 7. The Lucy Caldwell Fund. It is funded to assist All Marine Corps veterans of Vietnam service. This fund is to be used as a one time financial source to resolve a personal financial problem with a little bit of help.
- 8. Care of Our Own Fund. To provide free Life Membership in the Association to certain qualified

- disabled veterans with Third Marine Division service.
- 9. The Memorial Scholarship Fund. The Memorial Scholarship Fund program was established in 1969 to honor the loss in Vietnam on 14 Nov. 1967 of Third Marine Division Commanding Officer Bruno A. Hockmuth, at age fifty-seven. The first awards were presented in 1973. Since that time, our Association has as of the 2021 22 school year proudly awarded 831 industrious and outstanding students scholarship awards totaling \$692,500.00.

We also support Legacy Giving whereby Members and supporters of the 3MDA can help ensure the Association grows through legacy giving or inheritance bequests in order to continue providing educational and scholarship support and public outreach. A bequest can be made in the form of a specific gift of cash or property, or a percentage of the remainder of an estate or asset.



Old Business: None





Meeting closed with a prayer.



TUN TAVERN




The Marine Corps was born in Tun Tavern on 10-November 1775. But beyond that the Marine's recollection for detail will probably get fuzzy.

So here is the straight scoop.

In the year 1685, Sammuel Carpenter built

a huge "brew house" in Philadelphia. He located this tavern on the waterfront at the corner of Water Street and Tun Alley. The old English word "tun" means a cask, barrel, or keg of beer. So, with his new beer tavern on Tun Alley, Carpenter elected to christen the new waterfront brewery with a logical name, Tun Tavern.



Tun Tavern quickly gained a reputation for serving fine beer. Beginning 37 years later in 1732, the first meetings of the St. John's No. 1 Lodge of the Grand Lodge of the Masonic Temple were held in the tavern. An American of note, Benjamin Franklin, was its third Grand Master. Even today the Mason¬ic Temple of Philadelphia recognizes Tun Tavern as the birth-place of Masonic teachings in America.

Roughly ten years later in the early 1740's, the new proprietor expanded Tun Tavern and gave the addition a new name, "Peggy Mullan's Red Hot Beef Steak Club at Tun Tavern." The new restaurant became a smashing commercial success and was patronized by notable Americans, in -1747 the St. Andrews Society, charitable group dedicated to assisting poor immigrants from Scotland, was founded in the tavern.

Nine years later, then Col. Benjamin Franklin organized the Pennsylvania Militia. He used Tun Tavern as a gathering place to recruit a regiment of soldiers to go into battle against the Indian uprisings that were plaguing the American colonies, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and the Continental Congress later met in Tun Tavern as the American colonies prepared for independence from the English Crown.

On November 10, 1775, the Continental Congress commissioned Samuel Nicholas to raise two Battalions of Marines. That very day, Nicholas set up shop in Tun Tavern. He appointed Robert Mullan, then the proprietor of the tavern, to the job of chief Marine Recruiter - serving, of course, from

his place of business at Tun Tavern.

Prospective recruits flocked to the tav¬ern, lured by cold beer and opportunity to serve in the new Corps of Marines. So, yes, the Marine Corps and the tav¬ern thrived during this new relationship.

Tun Tavern still lives today. And, Tun Tavern beer is still readily available throughout the Philadelphia area.



INFAMOUS TUN TAVERN BEER John Beele, chapter member, who for 33 years carried the beautiful Iwo Jima flag obtaining signatures of Two Jima Veterans and then donated it to IJAA at the 75th Anniversary gathering in 2020, and at the same time he opened his last bottle of beer from Tun Tavern (that he had for many years). It was passed around for all of the Iwo Veterans who were present. They shared a sip (out of the bottle), and as they say, to polish it off" It was a well fermented brew!.



MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND (MSF) APPLICATIONS FOR 2022-2023

The MSF Board of Trustees has announced the application, eligibility requirements, and MSF Plan for the next academic year 2022-2023 are available on the Association website www.caltrap.org. This is a post-high school scholarship program for the children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of Assn members. Also eligible are recently discharged Marines, who served honorably with the Third Marine Division and military personnel attached to it e.g. men and women of the US Navy Hospital Corps, Chaplain Corps, etc. Scholarships generally range from \$500 to \$1,200 per academic year based solely on financial need but MSF Trustees may increase a scholarship more based on special circumstances.

Scholarships may be awarded for any approved course of study in an accredited college or university, and approved posthigh school trade school institution. Applicants must be enrolled in each semester for not less than twelve (12) credit hours. Applicants may also be married. Scholarships will not be given in excess of four (4) years of undergraduate study except for:

- Those undergraduate accredited degree programs where the undergraduate requirement is at least 150 credit hours or five (5) years of undergraduate study for graduation.
- Those postgraduate accredited degree programs where the applicant has been an MSF awardee for three (3) undergraduate years of study and has graduated at the end of the third year.

The MSF was established in 1969 to honor the loss in the Republic of Vietnam on 14 Nov 1967 of Third Marine Division Commanding Officer Major General Bruno A. Hockmuth. To date 831 scholarship awards of \$692,500 have been presented to deserving students based solely on financial need. Each year the prestigious LtCol Richard E. Jones USMC (Ret) scholarship

in the amount of \$1,200 is also awarded. The family of LtCol Jones, in memory of his service to his Country, Marine Corps, and the Association generously funds this scholarship annually for the applicant with the greatest financial need.



Those who have served in war know that it never leaves us. As a combatwounded Vietnam veteran, I know all too well the range of emotions that veterans of Afghanistan have been feeling these past few months and how those emotions can negatively affect their sense of well-being.

The anger, hurt and sadness veterans of that war and other conflicts are experiencing can be overwhelming. Pair these complex and divergent emotions with more than 20 months of personal, social and societal difficulties brought on



by the COVID-19 pandemic, and an alarming potential for countless mental health crises exists.

But I want every veteran to know this: You matter. Your service matters. Your sacrifice matters.

Every time I learn of a veteran dying by suicide, it hurts my heart knowing someone's demons got the better of them. It feels like a 7,000-mile sniper shot from our enemies. We beg anyone who is suffering not to let the enemy take another one of us, especially during the coming holiday season.

If you need help, there's absolutely nothing wrong with asking for it. While I know it takes tremendous strength to do so, I also know you possess the strength to seek help. If you're experiencing a mental health issue—including moral injury—and find yourself in need of attention, we urge you to call the Veterans Crisis Line at 1-800-273-8255. This free, confidential resource is available 24/7 and can connect at-risk veterans to services they need and have earned. You don't even need to be a veteran to call. Family and friends of veterans in need are encouraged to call as well, and doing so could very well save a life.

As an organization of veterans serving veterans for more than 100 years, we also know that we are some of the best resources available to our fellow veterans. Our shared connections are invaluable, and it's up to all of us to reach out to help each other process our emotions. I have no doubt many of you have already done so, but as we approach the holidays, I implore you to make that effort once again. You never know who you may save or what family you may save from unfathomable heartbreak.

Taking care of each other is what we do. It's in our blood. And it's why I'm so incredibly honored and proud to lead this organization filled with our nation's finest servants and advocates.

Thank you all for everything you do for each other and your fellow veterans. I truly hope each and every one of you has a wonderful and blessed holiday season filled with joyous memories alongside your families and friends. But most of all, I truly hope that each of you remembers, again, these unyielding truths: You matter. Your service matters. Your sacrifice matters.






