## President's Message



March, 2022

Hello, Third Marine Division Family,

It's time to book your Reunion Adventure in San Diego that includes a major event: celebrating the 80th Anniversary of the Activation of the Third Marine Division. The activation took place at the now defunct Camp Elliott, located at the present day MCAS Miramar. We will be at Miramar. on the exact date, 16 Sept 1942 - 16 Sept 2022. The Commanding General of the Third Marine Division, MajGen Jay M. Bargeron will be present to help unveil the historical marker. The reunion is 12 Sept - 18 Sept 2022. We have a member, Woody Williams, who actually trained at Camp Elliott on his way to the Pacific Theater and Iwo Jima, where his gallantry and heroism merited his receiving the Medal of Honor. I have personally invited him to come to the reunion. I have invited the Commandant of the Marine Corps to come as well. We will have media coverage too.

Registration and information is online at caltrap.org as well as this edition of the CALTRAP. Remember, if any members would like to get their CALTRAP emailed to them, and have not already signed up, please email either: rogerbacon45@yahoo.com; or RLNPLANO@HOTMAIL.COM. You will get your CALTRAP quicker.

Also, there are some tricky things to pay attention to. For now, there is a fairly generous limit as to the number of people who can attend MCRD graduation. The limit has been set by the Department of Defense and MCRD. That may change. But now we have a limit that we have to work with. So, first come, first serve. If we reach that limit with registrations, we

will start a list should they open it up to further numbers. If you want to go to graduation, sign up and pay. Should the maximum number be fulfilled, you will then go on a waitlist, at which time you will be notified. I have hopes the numbers will increase by then. I really think most everyone will be able to go. A trip to MCRD also includes a trip to Miramar. You may go to Miramar only if you wish. However, no one who registers in person at the hotel, will be allowed to go. All three bases we are going to have a cutoff time to clear everyone. The deadline is 13 Aug 2022.

Remember you are not registered until paid.

### MESSAGE FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Hello all Marines and Corpsmen

I'm Don Bumgarner and I would like to share a few thoughts with you. I served in Charlie Company,

1st Bn 3rd Marines in Viet Nam from February 1967 till March 1968. After returning from Nam, like most of you I continued with my life. I continued my schooling at a Junior College in Long Beach, California, and earned my goal of an AA Degree. Taking classes in Introduction to Law Enforcement, I eventually pursued a career in Law Enforcement and was a LA County Deputy Sheriff for 25 years, retiring in 1995 after a younger brother was killed in a car accident. I took his job in a family business for the next seven years.

In 2001-2002 I learned of the computer and found information about 1stBn/3rd Marines. I found a Charlie Company list of names. I saw names of possible guys I had served with in Nam. I wrote letters inquiring if they were the Marines I thought they were. Wow. I reconnected with a few of them. One, Ron Asher, lived approximately 35 miles from me. Ron and I connected, and together we attempted to contact as many C/1/3 Marines and Corpsmen as possible. Ron and I went to a 3rd Marine Division Reunion in Arizona. We met Bill Ervin there, with 1st Bn/3rd Marine Association.

Ron and I located many Marines from Charlie Company and at the 3rd Marine Division Reunion in Las Vegas in 2007 we had 50 guys from C/1/3 there. Double WOW! I saw guys from my 60mm Mortar Crew. There were many there that were at their first reunion. Roger Bacon, Ken Burkitt and Ron Asher and others I went to Nam with were there. After the Las Vegas Reunion, we all continued to go to more Reunions. At the 2011 Reunion, Ken and Roger finally talked me into returning to Viet Nam. Bill Ervin was conducting tours in Viet Nam at that time. In April 2012, Roger, Ken and I, along with Bill Taylor (he had gone to Nam with us too)


and his son went to Viet Nam for a 14 day trip. Bill Ervin and Ahn toured us throughout I-Corp, where we had been before. It turned out to be great trip and one that none of us will forget.

Through the years, Roger, Ken and I have attended most reunions. We were active with the 1/3 Association, and usually ran the 1/3 Bunker. Arnold Ewing came to his first reunion in Orlando. Arnold was in Mortars with me after joining C/1/3 in October 1967. My daughter attended the Colorado Springs Reunion for her first time. I think at the Branson reunion, Leslie, Beth (Ken's daughter), and Keri (Arnold's daughter) all attended.

In 2020 we planned to go to Washington DC for the reunion. That reunion got cancelled, but my daughter had arranged a mini-reunion to follow in the Smokey Mountains in Tennessee for a small group of us. Ken, Roger, Arnold, and their wives, plus the three daughters (Leslie, Beth and Keri) and me, and two of my cousins spent a week there. It was awesome, and a week I will never forget. We learned a lot about what each of us had done since we were in the Marines together. The bond we have as Marines, is something else. Almost like true brothers.

We all attended this past reunion in Fort Worth, Texas, but Roger, Ken and I are pretty busy at the reunion. My daughter planned a small get together for us at a mansion on the Gulf Coast in Kemah, Texas. It was a five day stay, and another awesome time had by all. There had been a hurricane through the area just prior to our arrival, and the pier out in the bay was destroyed. Still, our small group from C/1/3 did enjoy another mini-reunion together.

The mansion was offered at a reduced price and our small group again got together this past month (March 25 to April 2). Sgt. Bonnie and his wife, Betsey, joined us this time. The 12 of us had a great time together. We had almost nightly sit-down dinners



together; reminded me of growing up and the family eating together. We five Marines enjoyed each other's company and just soaked a lot in the pool, talking and hanging out.

I know a couple of years ago, that a group of Marines and Corpsmen from B/1/3 went back to Viet Nam and Bill Ervin had guided them also.

My main thought that I want to share, is that we are all getting older. If you have fairly good health and can travel, I hope you might find your old Marine buddies and do something like we have started to do. To spend valuable time with your old Marine friends. It is something you will like. You do not realize with that time in the Corps and Nam, how bonded you are, even today.

I always encourage those that have not been to a Reunion to go to one. Our next Reunion is in San Diego in September. Hope you all can make it! Then try to have your own mini-reunion. Both are worthwhile and good for your soul. You will not be disappointed.


### FROM THE ASSOCIATION MANAGER

when I faced special challenges in that far-off torn land, Vietnam. Each time I see a picture of a scene in Vietnam or read something about the war, my mind drifts back to those 13 months filled with horror.

I found this little poem that speaks to me in a special way:

#### **LETTING GO**

An old man stands as straight as time allows, tears form and follow the deep lines in his face... and he lets it go.

His reflection shimmers in the black stone behind the names of those he has known as a bugle plays its mournful tones... and he lets it go.

The flag snaps in the wind, a symbol of those who died and those who came home again, hurt, angry and alone, abandoned by those who should have known what it takes to be free... and he lets it go.

Turning, he walks slowly away weeping for what had to be – an old man, much like you and me.



## MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND (MSF) APPLICATIONS FOR 2022-2023

The MSF Board of Trustees has announced the application, eligibility requirements, and MSF Plan for the next academic year 2022-2023 are available on the Association website www.caltrap.org. This is a post-high school scholarship program for the children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren of Assn members. Also eligible are recently discharged Marines, who served honorably with the Third Marine Division and military personnel attached to it e.g. men and women of the US Navy Hospital Corps, Chaplain Corps, etc. Scholarships generally range from \$500 to \$1,200 per academic year based solely on financial need but MSF Trustees may increase a scholarship more based on special circumstances.

Third Marine Division Association — Memorial Scholarship fund (MSF) Application for the 2022-2023 Academic Year — Due no later than May 16, 2022 All information must be completed or marked n/a, in black or blue ink, printed legibly or typed.

Scholarships may be awarded for any approved course of study in an accredited college or university, and approved post-high school trade school institution. Applicants must be enrolled in each semester for not less than twelve (12) credit hours. Applicants may also be married. Scholarships will not be given in excess of four (4) years of undergraduate study except for:

- Those undergraduate accredited degree programs where the undergraduate requirement is at least 150 credit hours or five (5) years of undergraduate study for graduation.
- Those postgraduate accredited degree programs where the applicant has been an MSF awardee for three (3) undergraduate years of study and has graduated at the end of the third year.

The MSF was established in 1969 to honor the loss in the Republic of Vietnam on 14 Nov 1967 of Third Marine Division Commanding Officer Major General Bruno A. Hockmuth. To date 831 scholarship awards of \$692,500 have been presented to deserving students based solely on financial need. Each year the prestigious LtCol Richard E. Jones USMC (Ret) scholarship in the amount of \$1,200 is also awarded. The family of LtCol Jones, in memory of his service to his Country, Marine Corps, and the Association generously

funds this scholarship annually for the applicant with the greatest financial need.







### **REFLECTIONS**

As I search back through the layers of time, seeking the faces, the thoughts, and the fears that once populated this deserted stretch of earth, I feel almost intruder. It's as if I am a stranger to my own past. I reach inside my mind to recapture the feeling, the intensity of this place, only to find it is no longer there. I try to dig past the barriers that time has placed between who I am and who I was but find it is like dipping water with a sieve. The surface is stirred and the senses are aroused, but the thirst remains unquenched. I have become an observer, no longer a participant in the lost society of men who knew this land with an intimacy that few ever know.

But the land has not forgotten the days when young men with their implements of war sweated, bled, and died here. A yellow-green layer of brush and grass now covers the pock-scarred hillsides as they rise up from the valley like the twisted folds of a fine fabric tossed carelessly over the land. Around me, scraps of food packets lay scattered across the ground. An occasional fragment of



some unidentifiable object lies rusting in the reddish dirt, reflecting the mid-day sun. A discarded boot lies bleached and curled, half dissolved by time and weather. Shallow remains of fighting holes dot the hill side like the ruins of some vanished civilization. The land, like myself, has not healed completely but it is healing. Some of the scars will always remain, buried under a protective layer of new growth.
